Fish Frenzy

Fourteen-year-old Gus, his father Sean, and younger sister Talus return with their latest film shot mostly off the Rhode Island coast. Gus and Talus demonstrate how to make fishing lures, then find and catch the fish. This is the second film for the Nightengale family, who got their start with *Gull Island* when Gus was six years old. This documentary shows an appreciation for the world we live in... Rhode Island!

SET THE STAGE | THOUGHT-STARTERS

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Sean Nightengale started the Gus Outdoors educational video series back in 2010, when his son Gus was just six years old. Early on, Gus expressed interest in the naturalist work of Jeff Corwin and Steve Irwin, and began re-enacting these adventures in his own backyard. After seeing this passion for wildlife work, Sean began making films of Gus's adventures with the purpose of helping educate kids about the natural world. Since then, the Nightengales have created three episodes: Gull Island, Lizard Town and Fish Frenzy.

WORDS TO KNOW

- Schoolie: A fish, especially a young fish, that swims in a school. A school of fish is any group of fish that swims together in a coordinated manner.
- Tackle Box: Tackle refers to the equipment used by fisherman when fishing; a tackle box is a container that stores this fishing equipment.
- Naturalist: An expert in or student of natural history.
- Voice-Over Narration: A production technique in which a voice that is not part of the narrative (non-diegetic) is used in a radio, television production, filmmaking, theatre, or other presentations.
- Camera Shot: A single uninterrupted section of footage. Shots can be described by how close or far they are from the subject, or by the perspective it shows the audience.

TALK ABOUT IT | DISCUSSION

- · What did you learn about fishing or Rhode Island fishing culture from watching this film? What questions do you have?
- · What did you think about the choice to have Gus narrate the film? How might the documentary been different had it been narrated by Gus's dad or an adult naturalist? Would you have been as interested in the subject matter?
- Gus Outdoors is an educational series filmed in a documentary style. Are there any stylistic differences between this film and other documentaries you have seen?
- What traits do you think you need to have in order to be a good fisherman?
- Even though he is a fairly objective narrator, we also get to know his personality. How would you describe Gus's personality?
- Gus's family is made up of Rhode Island fisherman, and it is a tradition passed down through generations. What family traditions do you have? How have they been passed down? Do you plan on passing them down to your children?



Pay attention while watching

- Think about the different stories told in this documentary. How do they relate to each other?
- How does the filmmaker use images and sound to give the film a sense of place?

Materials Needed: Corks, wood, paint, spoons, paper clips (as hooks), miscellaneous materials
